In this edition, Gadjah Mada Journal of Tourism Studies publishes five articles:

- 1. A study of meaning-making practices in the development of heritage tourism using Lawang Sewu's case, Semarang. This study also identifies the stakeholders' dominant narration related to the development of Lawang Sewu heritage tourism by using interactive analysis method.

5. An assessment study of environmental aspect development strategy based on responsible tourism aspects in Titik Pandang Panenjoan, Ciletuh Geopark.
