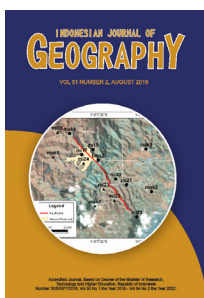

ON THE COVER



The control network, as shown in the figure, was developed to monitor the Sermo Fault deformation. The network consists of 15 stations distributed along the fault line. Several stations are located near the Sermo Reservoir. Three GPS campaigns have been carried out in 2016, 2017, and 2018. For the next campaign, it should be well designed so that the optimal network configuration is obtained.
